Welcome and thank you for howling for the WolfPack with me. At Thompson Rivers University we have good reason to be very proud of our varsity athletes, coaches and facilities.

The teams come to competition this year after one of their best seasons ever. Men's Volleyball won bronze in Canada West and at the nationals after only three seasons in Canadian Inter-university Sports (CIS) league. Men's soccer won the BCCAA title and were fourth in the country. Our longtime badminton coach Brad Pape was not only named BCCAA coach of the year but also CCAA coach of the year. Four of our badminton athletes won bronze medals at nationals.

It is major accomplishment to achieve top grades while playing competitive sports. Last season 13 members of the 'Pack received national attention for balancing both. The varsity athletes were named either Canadian College Athletic Association or Canadian College Athletic Sport-Scholar Athletes by achieving a minimum GPA of 3.50.

This year we have an opportunity to show the country our amazing athletic facilities at the Tournament Capital Center when we host the National College Soccer Championships, November 5 to 8 and for the second year host the McDonalds' Classic International Men's Volleyball Tournament in

January and the BCCAA Provincial Badminton Championships in February.

You should know that TRU's Athletics and Recreation programming isn't just for the elite student athlete. Our campus offers a number of recreation programs for students at all levels of athletic abilities for those who just want to meet new friends and have fun. More than 500 students take part in TRU's weekly intramural floor hockey, badminton, volleyball and basketball games each week.

There is a way that everyone, whether from the campus or the broader community, can participate in athletics and recreation at TRU. Our game schedules and results are posted on our website and I invite you to attend as many games as possible and enjoy and contribute to campus life.

The 2007-08 year was a very successful one for us with our Men's Volleyball team winning a bronze at the CIS Nationals, our Men's Soccer team capturing the BC College Athletics Association gold medal and a number of our badminton athletes winning bronze medals at the Canadian College Athletic Association Championships. Add to that, our longest serving coach (Badminton's Brad Pape) being named both the BC CAA and CCAA Coach of the year.

We welcome back returning athletes from not only throughout Canada, but from Denmark, Brazil, Turkey and the United States as well. This will be an exciting year with new faces directing both the Women's Volleyball team (Cal Wohlford) and Men's Basketball Team (Thom Gillespie).

They were runners up in the 2008 NCAA Championships. One month later, the top badminton athletes in BC will be here for the BC CAA Provincial Championships.

We've taken steps this year to become more involved in the community: from our Adopt a School program, to participating in events like Wendy's Dreamlift, and The CIBC Run for the Cure to our brand new "Blackwell Dairy" Kids club. Our philosophy is that not only are we providing a great education for our athletes, learning from first rate coaches and playing in top athletic leagues: but we are also exposing our athletes to the world of community volunteerism. It's our hope that they become 'well rounded' citizens as they head off to the 'real world'.

I'd like to thank our many coaches, team managers, event organizers, referees, officials and other who've given much time and talent to varsity athletics, and to those campus and community members who support our athletics teams by coming to games, buying seasons tickets, or volunteering their time and talents with the TRU Sports Task Force. Thank you for your interest and support of TRU Varsity Athletics. Once again, I extend to you on behalf of all of us at TRU Athletics and Recreation a very warm welcome and heartfelt thanks for supporting our teams.

Meet TRU WolfPack Head Coaches

Scott Reeves—Women's Basketball



Enters his third season on the bench of the WolfPack. He has his strongest recruiting class ever which includes Diane Schuetze (Vernon), Tracy Kocs (Port Moody), Jess Franz (Elgin Park) and Brianna Pound

(Valleyview). These signings move him a step closer to his goal: to create a strong women's basketball program at Thompson Rivers University.

Hiring Scott was a major coup for TRU. In the final three years of coaching high school basketball (Brookwood in Langley BC), he had a record of 124–2. He led them to three straight Provincial "AAA" Championship titles.

This past summer, Scott spent his time directing BC's Under 15 Girls Basketball team where his accomplishments included a silver medal at the Nationals which were held in Kamloops. In the past, he has worked with Elementary aged children to National Team players. He has sent 17 student athletes on from high school to post secondary on athletic an/or academic scholarships.

Scott has also been an assistant coach at the CIS level prior to TRU with Trinity Western. He holds a Bachelor degree in Human Kinetics from Trinity Western, a Bachelor degree in Education from the University of BC and is a Certified Level III coach.

His passion for basketball in nearly matched for golf. He is the father of two girls and a boy and is the founding member of the Kamloops Basketball Academy.

His Assistant is Chuck Ferguson. He too is into his third year with the WolfPack.

Brad Pape—Badminton



Brad was named both the Canadian College Athletics Association and BC Colleges Athletic Association coach of the year in 2007/08. He has coached the badminton team at TRU since its inception in the mid 1980's. In the

past, the team has earned many medals in both individual and team competition at the Provincials. Several TRU Badminton players have been to the National Championships. Last season: Garrett Babichuk and Andy Chu along with Marlee Mertins and Quinie Song all won medals at the Canadian Championships.

Brad's assistant coach is former player Robin Barlow.

Thom Gillespie—Men's Basketball



Thom was named Interim Head Coach of the Men's Basketball Program in August. He has a wealth of experience at the CIS level: as an assistant and head coach with both the University of Victoria and most recently the University of New

Brunswick. The 42 year old Gillespie spent the last 12 years with the University of New Brunswick Varsity Reds men's program, first as an assistant and then the last nine seasons as head coach.

Gillespie was the AUS coach of the year in 2002 and 2004. He is also a two time winner of the Petro Can Olympic Torch Scholarship and was a national candidate for the 3 M Coaching Award in 2002. He also had stints with Basketball New Brunswick (Head coach of Provincial U16, U17 and U19 boy's teams) and has been a guest coach and assistant coach with Canada Basketballs Senior National and Student teams.

He will be assisted by Brian Smith, who graduated after playing 5 years of University Basketball, most of it with TRU.

Patrick Hennelly—Men's Volleyball



Since Thompson Rivers University became a member of the CIS, no program has been more successful than Men's Volleyball. In his three years at the helm, Pat Hennelly has taken a team which was 1–20 in its first season to a bronze medal

victory in the National Championships in 2008.

Pat has an extensive coaching background from several different programs such as Northern Arizona (NCAA Division 1) and as an assistant coach with both the men's and women's programs at UBC.

He was a guest coach with Canada's Senior National Men's Volleyball team this past summer. Pat played for five years with Team BC including the 1989 Canada games and was a CCAA Silver medal winner with Langara College.

He holds two Bachelor degrees from UBC: one in Human Kinetics and the other in education as well as his level three NCCP coaching certificate.

Pat will work with four assistant coaches this year. Chad Grimm returns for his third season. Former players Tony Zylstra and Tim Flannigan (both members of the Bronze Medal Winners last year) will also help out along with Jessica Baskerville.

Cal Wohlford—Women's Volleyball



With Carrie Barrett away on mat leave (She delivered her second child, Samuel in August), The WolfPack were fortunate enough to hire Cal Wohlford as Interim Coach.

It is safe to say that Volleyball is running through Wohlford's veins. He is the President and Part Owner of the "Nothing But Volleyball" company. They design and produce a number of volleyball related shirts and other apparel.

But he has also been involved in the sport since 1990 in high school, club, college, provincial and university levels. Most recently, he has been an assistant with the UBC Thunderbirds (2006/2008). He was part of the T-Birds team which finished 5th at the 2008 CIS Nationals after finishing 4th the year previous.

"I'm ready even if it is just for the short time. Pretty excited about the athletes that I'm going to be coaching. I've followed this program from the start. My brother played here (TRU) when it was a college." Wohlford's brother Jim played volleyball with Thompson Rivers University in 1989 when it was known as the University College of the Cariboo.

His expectations are simple: "Its just getting familiar with what Carrie was doing. In fairness to the girls, its such a short time that I'm going to be here, we don't want to change too many things. I'm watching video of what they did last year and I'll hope to add a bit of what I've learned over the past few years. Our objective is to make playoffs and have a run at going to nationals." That's something the women's program at TRU has never done.

Wohlford will be assisted by Lauren Stockstad. Lauren graduated from the WolfPack program in May of 2008 and returned to TRU to finish her degree in Tourism. The other assistant is Ashley Shannick, a former UPEI player.

Bill Bilton—Golf



Bill Bilton is the coach of TRU's newest team: Men's Golf.

Ironically he was the coach when the old University College of the Cariboo had a Golf Program in 1998/99. "It just made sense to get together with

the people at TRU and try and put this program together."

The Dunes at Kamloops will not only be the home course for the WolfPack Golf Team, which will play in the BC College Athletics Association, but will also have its pros and assistant pros help in the development of the players.

For Bilton Junior, he wants to give back to the next generation of golfers: "For me, it's tremendous. I've had a lot of success in my career. But to come back and see the friends and family and become a part of the community is something that I am really looking forward to. I think we can have a great program at TRU."

Bilton has been a pro golfer since 1993. He has 15 professional wins under his belt, and was nominated for the British Columbia player of the year in 1999. Bilton Junior has been living in Florida for the past few years with his two young daughters, golfing and pursuing a real estate/ mortgage career. He'll live seven months of the year in Kamloops.

His assistant coach is Dion Sirianni. Sirianni, a native of Kamloops was an 8 time NCAA Champion and an all American in 2006. He attended Lees-Mcrae College in Banner Elk, North Carolina where he picked up a Bachelor of Science Degree.

"I'm excited about this opportunity." Sirianni explains. "I've been thinking about getting into coaching for a little while now, and this is perfect for me. I love to teach and what better opportunity to pass what I have learned down to the players, who want to get better."



Ray Chadwick—Baseball

Ray Chadwick has been coach of the UCC Sun Demons and now TRU WolfPack since 2003. He has a very strong reputation in North America as the coach to play for and his players have had continual success under his tutelage.

From 1983 to 1994 Ray was involved with five major league teams; the Angels, the White Sox, the Red Sox, the Royals and the Marlins. Ray isn't only concerned with the athleticism of his players but their academics as well. He has set a high G.P.A. standard for his players and gets results both on and off the diamond.

Sean Wallace—Men's Soccer



For over 25 years Sean Wallace has been involved with the college soccer program here in Kamloops; a time span that has covered his days as a player to his current position as head coach. When Sean was playing back in 1982 the team

was called the Cariboo College Chiefs. Then he became an assistant under Ralph Tedder for the University College of the Cariboo Sun Demons. And now, for the past eight seasons, Sean has been head coach for a soccer program that has again changed name but not competition level.

Sean has led his team to five out of seven BCCAA playoffs reaching a Provincial Silver Medal in the 2002/03 season. He was also named the BCCAA Coach of the Year in his second year as head coach for the 2001/02 season.

This year Sean has an exciting Co-Head Coach at his side. John Antulov brings an impressive level of knowledge from his playing days with the Simon Fraser University Clan, Vancouver 86'ers and Vancouver Croatia of the Premier League. He was also an assistant coach for the SFU Clan and is currently the Co-Head Coach of the Kamloops Youth Soccer Association.

His assistant coach is Hee Chung Young, who graduated from the WolfPack Program Last year and remains in kamloops working on his accounting certification with KPMG.

Eric Schweizer—Women's Soccer



Eric Schweizer has been involved with the UCC/ TRU coaching staff since 1995 when he served as assistant coach to the women's team until 2003 when he assumed the position of head coach. His involvement with the sport at the

high school and community level has been since 1974.

Since joining the UCC Sun Demons coaching staff, Eric has helped lead the women to three national silvers in 1995, 1996 and 1998 before winning provincial and national gold in 1999. In 2002, the Sun Demons won BCCAA provincial gold and CCAA national silver. In his first year as the head coach, 2003, Eric led the Sun Demons to another provincial and national silver medal. TRU won the BC and National Silver Medal in 2006 and made it to the Provincial gold medal game last year (2007) where they lost and didn't qualify for the nationals. Eric has consistently put out a strong team and the future looks bright for the program as a move to the CIS is in the near future.

A retired high school teacher, Eric also coaches a ladies city soccer team here in Kamloops. In 2006, Eric was awarded Kamloops Sports Council Coach of the Year honors.

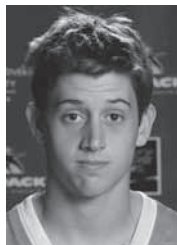

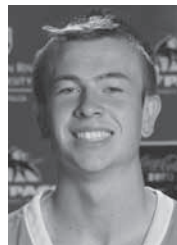

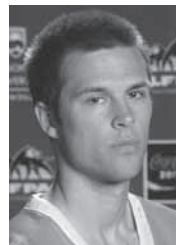

Thompson Rivers University WolfPack Men's Basketball

The 2008/09 CIS Campaign will certainly be one of transition for the TRU WolfPack. Late in the summer, the Pack were lucky enough to hire Thom Gillespie as their interim head coach. Gillespie spent 12 years as an Assistant and head coach at the University of New Brunswick. He took them to their first National Championship appearance in 37 years. Over two decades, he also coached at various levels with Basketball New Brunswick.

Gillespie has also experience with the University of Victoria, Basketball Saskatchewan and was with Canada Basketball's coaching pool from 2000–2006 where his duties included being the assistant coach with the National Student team which went to the FISU games in Turkey.

He'll be assisted this year by Brian Smith. Smith is moving from the court to the bench after graduating from the WolfPack program last June.

One of his old teammates will be the cornerstone of the TRU attack this year. 6–7 forward Jeff Friesen was coaxed into taking some Business courses. Friesen, who graduated ahead of his eligibility in 2006 with a business degree will be taking the courses around his job at CIBC.

"Getting the chance to play again is something that I have looked forward to the last couple of years, but never thought it would come to fruition," says Friesen.

TRU did sign some quality guards out of High School. Liam Wear (Vernon), Charles Barton and Mike Conlin (Seaton) and homegrown Hudson Naylor (Sa-Hali). The amount of playing time they'll get in their Inaugural CIS campaign will depend on the situation on the court.

Drew Bleth (4th year, Ridgefield, Washington) is expected to anchor the back-court. Much will be expected from 2nd year forward George Aramide (London, England), and 6–5 forward Matt Perry (Smithers, BC).

Aramide isn't the only international player to wear a WolfPack uniform this year. 1st year guard Felix Oberlaender hails from Jena Germany.

Those first year players will be joined by the Canada West Pacific Division Rookie of the Year Kaitlyn Widsten (Tsawwassen, BC), top rebounders Jessica Mulock (North Vancouver, BC) and Michele Dimond (Port Moody, BC).

Forward Kayla Forsyth (Vernon, BC) and Kelsie Baker (Kamloops, BC) will be asked to provide more of a leadership role this season. The 2008-09 campaign will be the last for guard Sarah Cameron. 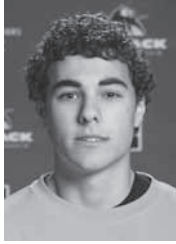

If there's one team to watch among all the WolfPack club's this year, it could very well be the Men's Volleyball Team. After all, they have the most pressure on their shoulders. After winning a bronze medal at both the Canada West Final Four and the CIS Nationals, Pat Hennelly's crew will be under the microscope from day one.

Steadily improving in their first three years in the CIS, The WolfPack will be one of the forces to be reckoned with in Canada West this year. Only three players from last years squad have graduated (Libero Graham Allard (Prince George, BC), Setter Tim Flannigan (Prince George, BC) and Middle Tony Zylstra (Stony Plain, AB). Flannigan and Zylstra will spend part of this season finishing their degrees and acting as Assistant Coaches with the WolfPack. Year 4 of the WolfPack Women's Program in the CIS sees a change on the bench. Longtime Coach Carrie Barrett has had to step back for a year. Barrett and husband Simon Fedun (now the men's coach of the NAIT Oaks of the Alberta College League) welcomed their second child in September.

Taking over is Cal Wohlford who comes here after many years as an assistant with the UBC Thunderbirds program. Wohlford is no stranger to University and Club volleyball, coaching in that program as well for a number of years.

Assisting him with the program this year will be Ashley Shannik (former UPEI player), and Lauren Stockstad. Stockstad was the lone player to graduate from the WolfPack program last season. She will be coaching at the same time as finishing her degree in Tourism.

Gone from last years team which finished in the Canada West are Kim Olness, Laura Battison and Tanis Hoeltgen. There are a few new faces in the WolfPack lineup 6-1 inch Outside Hitter Anna Dyakiewicz (pronounced die-aka-vitch) spent the last season playing with the Rollins College Tars of Winter Park Florida (Sunshine State Conference NCCAA Div 2). The WolfPack went overseas to fill a hole in the middle position: 6-2 inch middle Lykke Degner (pronounced Luka) from Denmark.

Degner's addition brings the total number of Danes on the roster to two (2nd year setter Stine Christiansen is the other).

The WolfPack also picked up six-foot middle Michella Domo. She too played US College Volleyball with Canisius College of Buffalo, New York. Domo and Dyakiewicz are ineligible to suit up with TRU until early November.

2007–08 A Season Of Improvement For The WolfPack

The 2007/08 Sports season at Thompson Rivers University was one where the rest of the country took notice of the program.

Pat Hennelly's Men's Volleyball team, in their third year of CIS play came up with a Bronze Medal at the Canada West Final Four. They followed that up with a Bronze Medal victory at the CIS National Championships in Laval. Like many of their matches leading into the nationals, the WolfPack were forced to go 5 sets before beating Dalhousie. It was the TRU Program's first medal at the CIS Level. First year outside hitter Gord Perrin (Creston, BC) was not only named to the CIS all rookie team, but was named the Canada West Rookie of the Year. He was also chosen as a CIS Finals All-Star. Over the summer, Gord was selected to Canada's Junior National team which competed at the NORCECA World Qualifying tournament in El Salvador. He was named the tournaments top hitter.

Men's Volleyball wasn't the only team to win a national medal. Members of the WolfPack Badminton Team won medals at the Canadian College Championships in Sackville, New Brunswick. Playing for the BC Selects: Garrett Babichuk (1st year, Kelowna BC), Andy Chu (4th year, Taiwan) along with Quinie Song (2nd year, China) and Marlee Mertins (1st year, Salmon Arm, BC) were winners of Bronze Medals.

The WolfPack's soccer teams have traditionally been among the province's best: and 2007/08 was no different. Sean Wallace brought on John Antulov as a Co-Head Coach. The two men helped direct the WolfPack to a BC College Athletic Association Gold medal. They beat Kwantlen 4–3 in Penalty Kicks. That was followed up by a fourth place finish at the Nationals in Halifax. Fourth-year defender James Byra (Sardis, BC) was named a first team all-star at the CCAA finals, a first team BCCAA all-star and was named top defender provincially. Forward Hatem Abdulghader (1st year, Tripoli) was also a National and Provincial first team all-star. Those two, along with Stu Jameson (1st year, Kamloops, BC) were Provincial first team all-stars. Jameson was also named BCCAA Rookie of the Year. Allan Connor (2nd year, Kamloops BC) was named Top Keeper and MVP at the Provincials.

Eric Schweizer's women's program had a strong regular season but finished third in the BC CAA playoffs, downing Douglas College 4–3 on penalty kicks. Shannen Meyer (2nd Year, Kamloops BC) was named an All Canadian. Sweeper Cari Sutcliffe (1st year, Kamloops, BC) was chosen as BC CAA rookie of the year. Both players, along with Shantelle Cooper (4th year, Nanaimo, BC) and Val Goddard (2nd year, Kamloops, BC) were first team provincial all-stars.

The WolfPack Baseball team, under the tutelage of former Major Leaguer Ray Chadwick, got off to a great start in the spring league. After winning 12 of their first 13 games to leap atop of the Canadian College Baseball, the WolfPack had to forfeit most of those victories after it was ruled that infielder/pitcher Jeff Paz (Kamloops, BC) was ruled ineligible. The WolfPack battled back to win most of their remaining games and squeak into the playoffs. Once there, they made it to the final where they were defending their league title. They fell 4–3 to the host Prairie Baseball Academy Dawgs in Lethbridge, Alberta.

Scott Reeves and his Women's Basketball program went 1 and 22 in the standings, but they made some improvements in their overall play. Guard Kaitlyn Widsten (1st year, Tsawwassen, BC)

was the Canada West Pacific Division Rookie of the year. Forward Michelle Dimond (1st year, Port Moody, BC) was one of the teams top rebounders in the second half of the year. Both are expected to make major contributions this coming season. Reeves hit the road and recruited a number of top high school players for 2008. They include Tracy Kocs (Port Moody, BC), Jess Franz (Elgin Park, South Surrey, BC) and Diane Schuetze (Vernon, BC).

The Men's Basketball team, under Nevin Gleddie improved from 1 and 22 during the 2006/07 year to 3 and 20 last year. They were led by Kamar Burke (2nd year, Mississauga, Ontario), and Brian Smith (5th year, Maple Ridge, BC). Smith has since graduated and is returning in 2008/09 as an assistant coach under new head man Thom Gillespie, who joins the program from the University of New Brunswick.

The WolfPack Women's Volleyball program was edged out of playoff contention in the final few weeks of the season. Carrie Barrett got some solid performances from Stine Christensen (1st year, Ribe, Denmark). She solidified the setter position. Fellow first year players Kelly Asleson (Richmond, BC) and Amanda Frayne (Kamloops, BC) made an impression. Lauren Stockstad was the WolfPack's only graduating player. The native of Surrey, BC is returning in 2008/09 as an assistant coach under Cal Wohlford. The former UBC assistant was appointed interim head coach while Barrett delivered her second child.

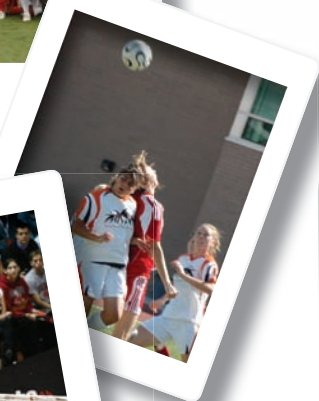

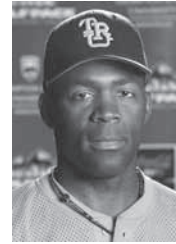

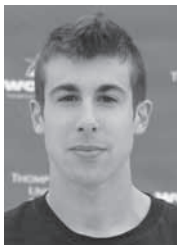
Thompson Rivers University WolfPack Men's Baseball

Thompson Rivers University WolfPack Golf

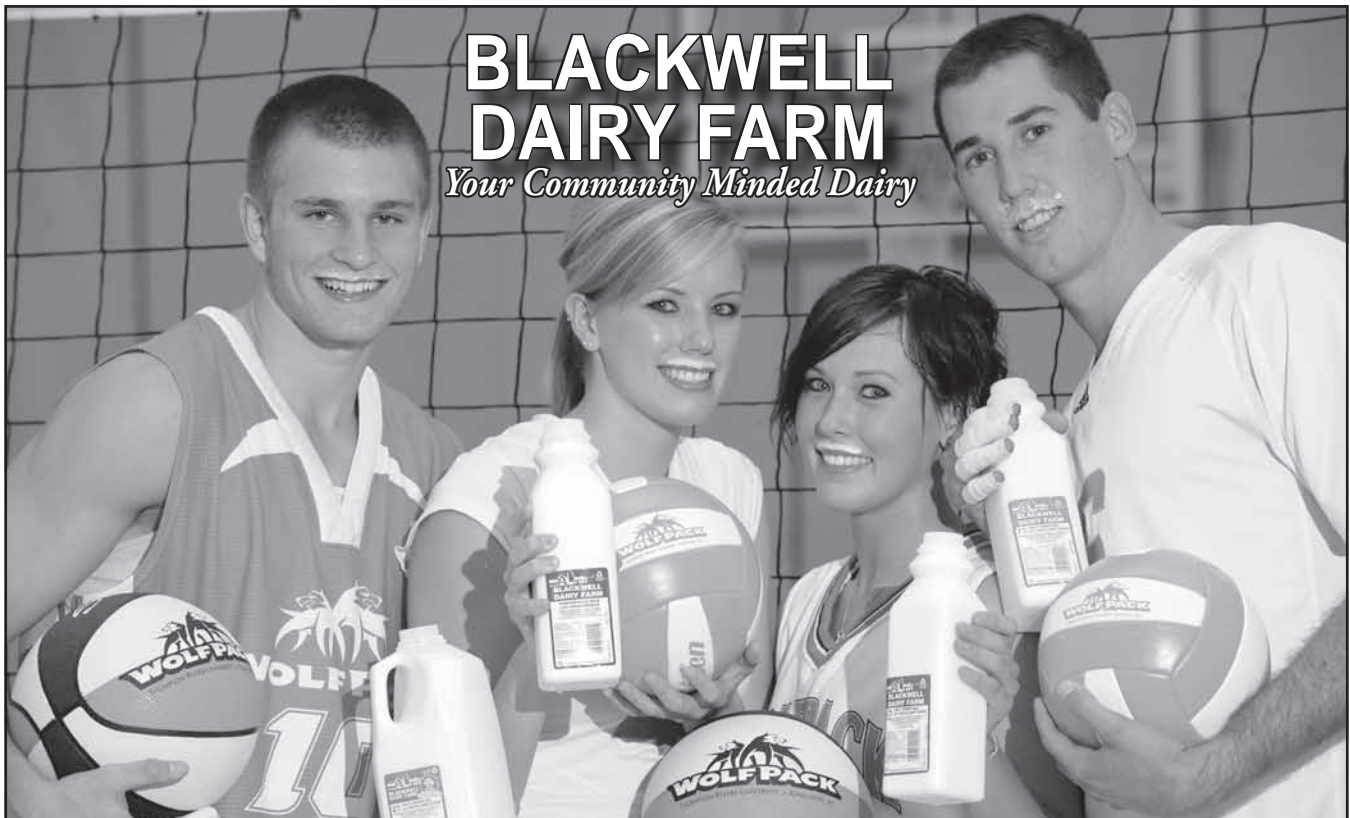
