# President's Welcome



As we enter this season, we have added a 10th varsity sport to our stable. Hockey has returned to TRU for the



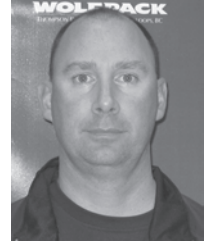

# Meet TRU WolfPack Head Coaches

## Scott Reeves: Women's Basketball



2009-10 marks his fourth year at the helm of the program. It's expected that he will see the fruits of two years of hard recruiting. Last season, the likes of Diane Schuetze (Vernon, BC), Tracy Kocs (Port Moody, BC) and

Lindsay Dekoff (Chilliwack, BC) all got valuable experience in their first year of CIS play.

Much more is expected of them and the rest of the players as they strive for credibility in arguably the toughest league in the CIS.

Since coming to Kamloops, Scott, his wife Tara and three children have quickly established themselves as the "first family of basketball". Not only does he coach the WolfPack, but he was a founder of the Kamloops Basketball Academy. Over the last three years, the KBA has grown from 30 to over 100 participants. He has helped develop players who've moved onto regional and Provincial teams. The KBA consists of boys and girls from kindergarten to grade 12. This past year, the KBA and Scott's work was recognized in a Vancouver Province article.

For the second straight summer, Scott handled the head coaching chores with the BC Under 15 girls basketball team. Their schedule included playing at the Nationals which were held at the Tournament Capital Center. His wife Tara helped organize the event, which was brought to Kamloops for a second year.

His background as a Certified Level III coach includes leading Brookwood Secondary in Langley to three straight Provincial "AAA" High School Championships while amassing a record of 124-2. He was previously an assistant coach with Trinity Western University. Scott holds a Bachelor degree in education from UBC and a Bachelor degree in Human Kinetics from Trinity Western.

He is assisted this year again by Chuck Ferguson: now into his fourth year with the WolfPack.

## Patrick Hennelly: Men's Volleyball



It's hard to deny that the most successful coach of late with the WolfPack has been Pat Hennelly. In his four years at the helm of the Men's Volleyball team, Thompson Rivers has won three medals—two Canada West Bronzes

(2008, 2009) and a CIS bronze medal (2008). A shrewd judge of talent, Pat has put together winning squads utilizing top Canadian talent and that from abroad. The WolfPack has had players from Denmark, Monaco and Turkey in its line up the past few years. He is looking forward to being a not-so-friendly host this March when TRU hosts the 2010 CIS Nationals. The goal for his club is to win it all.

In the past, Pat has taken his teams abroad to train. This year, he's being assisted by Dr. Han-Joo Ohm of South Korea. He is considered to be one of the world's top coaches. He is spending a year sabbatical from SKK University at Thompson Rivers.

Pat has an extensive coaching background from several different programs such as Northern Arizona (NCAA Division 1) and as an assistant coach with both the men's and women's programs at UBC.

He was a guest coach with Canada's Senior National Men's Volleyball team in 2008. He holds two Bachelor Degrees from UBC: Human Kinetics and education. He has his level III NCCP coaching certificate.

Firmly dedicated to promoting his sport, Pat has been instrumental in helping develop a 'club' program in Kamloops since his arrival to the city.

Besides Dr. Ohm, Chad Grimm is back as an assistant coach for a fourth season.

## Brad Pape: Badminton



Brad is the longest serving coach with the TRU Athletic Program. He has coached the badminton team since its inception in the mid 1980's. He was named the Canadian College Athletic Association and the BC College Athletic

Association Coach of the year in 2007-08. He had seven of his athletes medal at the Provincial Championships last season. He is assisted again this year by former player Robin Barlow. The teams manager is another former player, Becky Barlow. When not coaching, Brad is a successful realtor in Kamloops.

## Thom Gillespie: Men's Basketball



Thom is into his second season as Interim Head Coach of the Men's Basketball Program. He came to TRU after spending 12 seasons with the University of New Brunswick Varsity Red's men's program, first as an assistant and

then as head coach. He has as wealth of CIS experience with both the University of New Brunswick and the University of Victoria.

A two time winner of the AUS coach of the year (2002, 2004), Thom is also a two time winner of the Petro Can Olympic Torch scholarship and was a national candidate for the 3 M Coaching Award in 2002. He coached many Provincial teams while living in New Brunswick and was a guest coach and assistant coach with Canada Basketball's Senior National and Student Teams.

He is an avid baseball fan with the Boston Red Sox being his team of choice. The hockey team he's likely cheering for is the Buffalo Sabres.

Thom will be assisted again this season by former player Brian Smith (now into his second campaign on the bench) and Sarah Cameron, who graduated after playing 5 seasons with the WolfPack women's team.



# WOLF PACK

### Cal Wohlford: Women's Volleyball



This is Cal's second year at the helm of the WolfPack program on an Interim basis. Cal is the President and Part owner of the "Nothing But Volleyball" and "Renegade Printing" companies which he runs at the same

time as coaching at TRU.

In his first year on the bench, the WolfPack program reached new heights. It knocked off a Nationally ranked team for the first time ever (Brandon, ranked 3rd at the time). TRU also appeared in the National top 20 rankings for the first time in two years (two weeks finishing at number 13).

He has been involved in the sport since 1990 in high school, club, college, provincial and University levels. Most recently, he was an assistant with the UBC Thunderbirds Men's program (2006-08).

Cal's brother Jim played volleyball at TRU when it was the University College of the Cariboo (1989).

Cal and his lovely wife Leanne had their first child this past year when Rorie Tristan was born in Kamloops on January 10, 2009. Being a great 'volleyball daughter', she chose to make her arrival during a 'bye week'.

He'll be assisted again this year by former players Laura Plouffe and Dani Bercelli. Laura is into her first year as an assistant. Dani has coached before (in 2007-08).

### Ray Chadwick: Baseball



Ray Chadwick enters his sixth year as head coach of the WolfPack Baseball program. Chadwick is a former major league player (Angels, White Sox, Red Sox, Royals and Marlins from 1983-1994). He has a very strong reputation

in North America as the coach to play for and his players have had continual success under his tutelage. He isn't only concerned with the athleticism of his players but also their academics. He has set a high G.P.A. standard for his players and gets results both on and off the diamond. Their 2009 Canadian College Baseball title was their third and second in three years.

Will Devick, Dave Arthurs, Ben Bradford, Adam Arnold, Pat Brown and Duaine Bowles are assistants with the team.

### Sean Wallace: Men's Soccer



2008 saw Sean collect his second BC College Athletic Association Male Coach of the Year honor. He has been involved with the soccer program here for over 25 years: as a player, assistant and head coach. Sean enters his ninth season

running the program. The Men's program has made the BCCAA playoffs six of the last eight years, winning a silver medal in 2002-03 and 2007-08.

Sean will again be co-coaching with John Antulov. He brings an impressive level of knowledge from his playing days with the Simon Fraser University Clan, Vancouver 86'ers and Vancouver Croatia of the Premier League. John was also an assistant coach for the SFU and is currently on the board of the Kamloops Youth Soccer Association.

They will be assisted by Hee Young Cheung, a former player who is into his second year as an assistant.

### Tom McManus: Women's Soccer



He might be new to TRU, but Tom McManus is well known in the Canadian Soccer Community. McManus (who is also the head coach with Kamloops Youth Soccer), has coached at many different levels of the sport: from Canada's

National Team, to CIS (McMaster University, University of Saskatchewan), to pros (Winnipeg Fury of Canadian Soccer league) to even minor teams.

Recently elected into the Manitoba Sports Hall of Fame, Tom knows that he has big shoes to fill replacing the retiring Eric Schweizer "Eric has left me with a solid nucleus of players. I hope to be able to maintain and build on that." McManus played professional soccer for 15 years before turning to coaching.

He retained Kelly Shantz and Glen Archer, Schweizer's two long time assistants for his coaching staff. They are joined by Katie Clark. Clark, the all-time leading scorer in school history, has become a coach after playing the last five seasons.

### Bill Bilton Jr: Men's Golf



2008 was truly a life changing experience for Bill Bilton Junior. He returned to Kamloops and help resurrect the WolfPack golf program, which was dormant for nearly a decade. All that transpired was having one of his golfers (Adam

Gruber) win the BC College Athletic Association gold medal for lowest stroke total. The team itself captured the silver medal. From there, it was onto the Canadian College Athletics Association Championships in PEI. The upstart WolfPack captured the overall title with Shawn Vanderwal taking the individual crown in a playoff.

Bilton is back for his second campaign with a new assistant coach in Dale Beauchamp, a former player with Simon Fraser University. This is Bill's second tenure leading the TRU golf program. He was the head coach with the University College of the Cariboo in 1998-99. He has been a pro golfer since 1993 with 15 professional wins under his belt. He was nominated for the British Columbia player of the year honour in 1999. He continues to live half the year in Florida with his two young daughters where he golfs and is pursuing a real estate/mortgage career.

Bill will be assisted by Dale Beauchamp. Beauchamp, who was born and raised in Kamloops and attended Simon Fraser University on a Golf Scholarship (1985-89). He also attended Cariboo College in 1984-85).

He expects to handle most of the instruction assisting in the area of the short game while Bilton concentrates on the 'swinging' aspect of the team's development. Both will coach the mental/course management side of the game.

### Chris Hans: Men's Hockey



Chris is the coach of the newest team in the WolfPack family. He is no stranger in local hockey circles. The 46 year old Hans has coached for a number of years in the Kamloops Minor Hockey system at various levels including Major Midget.

His coaching resume includes stints coaching Junior "B" and Junior "A" and in Europe. He continues a tradition of fine hockey coaches at the school, dating back to Cariboo College in the 70's,80's and 1990. He will be assisted by: Andre Larouche (goaltenders) and David Boychuk (player-coach).



# 2008–09 Season Ends On A High Note

The 2008-09 athletic season started and ended on a high note for the Thompson Rivers University WolfPack. September saw the emergence of the program's newest team. Men's Golf returned to the fold after nearly a decade away. Bill Bilton Junior and his father spearheaded the resurrection of the program out of their course: The Dunes at Kamloops.

The result was something out of a story book. The rookie laden squad finished second in the BC College Athletic Association Tour with one of their players (Adam Gruber) taking home the gold medal for the lowest combined stroke total. It didn't take the Thompson Rivers University WolfPack Golf team long to notch their first championship on the tour. In only their second tournament, the WolfPack captured the event in Nanaimo in September. They had a two round, five man team total of 595. That was four shots ahead of the University of the Fraser Valley and 21 shots ahead of the host team: Vancouver Island University. That tournament saw Brett Martin win the individual title. Martin, the 6-4 first year player from Okanagan Falls, BC followed up his first round 70 with a second round 75.

Bilton then took his team to the Canadian College Nationals in PEI in October. They won the gold medal. They had a three round, four man combined total of 880 strokes. That was six better than defending champion Humber College of Ontario. University of the Fraser Valley and Mount Royal of Calgary were third at 890.

Individually, Shawn Vanderwal of TRU (first year, Kamloops, BC) won the title in a playoff. He and second round leader Mitch Lock of University of the Fraser Valley finished deadlock with a 54 hole total of 217. Vanderwal shot a par 72 on the final day of the tourney at the Fox Meadow Golf and Country Club. Lock was at three over 75. The TRU Golfer shot 74 in the first round and 71 in the second.

The squad was later named the Kamloops Sports Council Team of the Year for 2008.

The WolfPack Soccer teams were also powers in the BCCAA. Eric Schweizer made his final year as coach of the Women's program a success. They finished first in the league standings only to fall 3-0 to Langara in the gold medal match in the playoffs. TRU hosted the CCAA Nationals where the WolfPack Women lost in the gold medal match again to Langara. This time, the score was 2-1 with the winning goal coming in added time.

The WolfPack men's team finished third in the regular season but wound up taking the silver medal in the playoffs, losing 3-1 to eventual National Champion Capilano University Blues. At the Nationals, TRU needed penalty kicks to beat FX Garneau 3-2 to capture fifth place.

In the Awards category: Both Schweizer and Sean Wallace were named the BC College Athletic Association coaches of the year. James Byra and Shantelle Cooper were named All Canadians. Cooper was the BCCAA Player of the Year. Joining Cooper on the BC CAA First All star team were goaltender Shannon Kelly (5 th year, Kamloops, BC), defender Shannen Meyer (3rd year, Kamloops, BC) and defender Cailyn Newman (1st year, Sherwood Park, Alberta). Forward Kerry Hill (2nd year, Kamloops, BC) and midfielder Jessie Lebert (1st year, Kamloops, BC) are on the second team.

The WolfPack Men's team had four players chosen to the all star teams. Defender Byra (5 th year, Chilliwack, BC), Goalie Allan Connor (3rd year, Salmon Arm, BC) and Defender Adam Dodgson (3rd year, Kamloops, BC) are on the first team. Midfielder Tim Unaegbu (3rd year, Port Coquitlam, BC) was chosen for the second all star team.

At the Nationals: Four members of the Women's soccer team and one from the Men's team were named Tournament All stars Kelly was named on the All Canadian Women's team along with Newman, Anca Duncan (1st year, midfielder, White Rock, BC) and Meyer . The lone member of the Men's team to be recognized as an all star was Davis Stupich (1st year, midfielder, Ladysmith, BC).

On the volleyball court: It was another medal winning season for Pat Hennelly and his Men's team. Although they went to the CIS Nationals for a second straight year, they finished in sixth place. But the week previous, they came away with their second straight bronze medal in Canada West play. They downed the University of Winnipeg Wesmen in straight sets (28-26, 25-23, 31-29).

The WolfPack had one player named to the Canada West All star team. Gord Perrin (2nd year, outside hitter, Creston, BC) was named to the 2nd All-Star team. Josh Boruck (1st year, Revelstoke, BC) was named to the CIS All Rookie team. He became the third straight TRU player to get that honour following in the footsteps of Perrin and Robin Schoebel (outside hitter, Monaco).

The WolfPack won their own International Holiday Tournament going through unbeaten including two wins against NCAA powerhouse: Pepperdine University Wave of California.

Cal Wohlford took over the Women's program on an interim basis. He made great strides as the team was vying for a playoff spot until the dying weeks of the season. Their campaign included a victory over Nationally ranked Brandon. The WolfPack themselves, saw their name appear twice in the CIS top 20 rankings.

In Basketball, The WolfPack teams struggled but made strides in the growth department. Scott Reeves' Women's team won more games than any time in his tenure. They also lost a number of games in overtime or by less than ten points. His rookie and sophomore laden roster came second at a Christmas time tournament in San Diego. They turned a lot of heads in the Canada West and are expected to be one of the teams battling for a playoff spot in the coming years. Post Diane Schuetze (Vernon, BC) became the first TRU basketball player ever to be named to the CIS All Rookie Team.

Thom Gillespie came into the Men's program late. He was unable to recruit but was still able to turn around the image of a program which was struggling. His team was led by fourth year players Drew Bleth (Ridgefield, Wash) and Jeff Friesen (Duncan, BC).

The WolfPack Badminton team didn't have any one heading to the CCAA Nationals. But, they did have four medals after hosting the 2009 BC College Athletic Association Badminton Finals. Brad Pape's team came away with two silvers and two bronzes

TRU finished second in the team competition and wound up fourth in the overall season standings.

Entering the 2008-09 campaign, WolfPack Baseball head coach Ray Chadwick was thinking that he would have a major task on his hands. And why not? His entire starting outfield (all of which had been team MVP's over the past three years) had graduated. And his trademark pitching staff was a shadow of its former self. The final nail in the coffin could have come from Mother Nature. An unusually long winter left the 'Pack having to go to Arizona to find a place to play outdoors. The start of the Canadian College Baseball Conference season was thrown into disarray because of the poor weather .

Still, the baseball team persevered. After finishing with a record of 19 and 9 and a second place spot in the CCBC's Chris Reitsma Division, TRU went to the League Championship Tournament and went through it unbeaten. The WolfPack captured their third Canadian College Baseball Championship.. Chadwick's crew got a walk off homer from Matt Walker (outfielder/pitcher Bowen Island, BC) in the bottom half of the ninth inning to beat the defending league champion and host team Prairie Baseball Academy Dawgs 9-8. It was the WolfPack's second CCBC title in three years.

"There was something special happening on that field today," said Chadwick. "Here we were playing a team which beat us six of our last eight meetings, and we trailed 5-1 after two innings. Still, our players knew that we could come back and that's what they did."

The 'Pack found themselves down 5-0 after an inning in a half.

The WolfPack scored three in their half of the third to tie the contest at 3. But PBA wasn't going to go down without a fight. The Dawgs notched a pair of runs in the top of the fourth to go up 7-5. TRU countered with three of their own in the bottom of the fourth to go up 8-7.

PBA added another in the fifth inning to draw even before Walkers ninth inning heroics. Jordan Broatch (RHP, White Rock, BC) was the winning pitcher. Broatch tossed a complete game 11 hitter, surrendering five earned runs, striking out three and walking one.

That put a capper on the 2008-09 Campaign for TRU Athletics. What will this season hold in store? We will have to wait and see. With all the coaches returning for another season and the addition of Ice Hockey, the only direction the WolfPack appear to be going is up.

# WolfPack Athletes Excel On The International Stage

While most students were working or taking it easy this summer, some members of the Thompson Rivers University WolfPack were abroad representing the school, their sport and their country in International competitions.

Basketball player Beth McNeill (2nd year, forward, North Vancouver, BC) along with volleyball players Kyle Donen (4th year, libero, White Rock, BC) and Gord Perrin (3rd year, outside hitter, Creston, BC) were all chosen for national teams.

McNeill is a multi-sport athlete. She was selected to participate with Canada's U-20 women's rugby squad at the Four nations Cup in London England. Donen was in Israel in July as part of Canada's entry in the volleyball competition at the Maccabiah games. Perrin was one of the top players for our junior national team at the World Junior Men's Volleyball Championships in India held in July and August.

"I got my first international caps during the tourney," says McNeill, who has played both Standoff and Inside/Outside Center. "I'm so glad I decided to try out for the team. Playing has been a great experience."

The Canadian team has failed to win a game during the round robin portion—falling to the United States, Wales and the host English. "We haven't had the luxury of preparing as a team before the tournament like the others," says McNeill. "Our team was picked in May and we had only met each other for five days before we played our first match. Despite that, our progress has been great. We are very young with most of us playing internationally for the first time."

McNeill says the overall experience has been eye opening. "One thing that blew me away has been the amount of girls here on rugby scholarships. Coming out of high school, I had no idea they gave those out. Mainly because the recruiting process for rugby is a lot more low key compared to basketball."

"It's been a long summer but has been lots of fun," said Perrin, who was part of Canada's 12th place finish at the world championships.

"I made some new friends and learned a lot more about the game."

"The Maccabiah Games were an amazing experience on so many levels," Donen explains. "Being involved in an International competition, staying in accommodations with all the volleyball teams at our event. Being part of a larger Canadian team (400 Athletes) and Israel, the country is something I'll remember for the rest of my life. I don't think there will be a let down." Donen's squad wound up with a bronze medal.

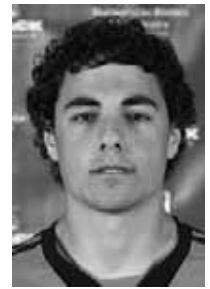
