► Apprenticeship Funding

Advanced Education Minister Amrik Virk was on campus Nov. 19 to announce a new front-loaded apprenticeship pilot that focuses the main block of classroom and co-op training in the first 61 weeks instead of the traditional block-release model where classroom work is spread over four years. The approach will help the commercial truck and transport mechanic apprentices move into their work-based training already equipped with skills their employer-sponsors needs, and allows the apprentice to stay in the workplace without interruptions to go back into the classroom.

- ➤ TRU faculty from a variety of disciplines were among the panelists at the REEL Change Sustainability Film Festival October 17 to 19. Participating in the forums were Darryl Carlyle-Moses, Geography (screening of Lost Rivers); Peter Tsigaris, Economics (Revolution); Ed Walker, Culinary Arts (Hungry for Change), Paul Clark, Marketing, International Business and Entrepreneurship (Plastic Paradise), Kevin Scollon, Horticulture (In Organic We Trust), and Susan Purdy, Biological Sciences (Salmon Confidential).
- ▶ Stacey Jyrkkanen, Health and Safety, was elected to the International Association of Emergency Managers (IAEM) Canada Government Affairs Committee, which monitors, raises awareness and conducts advocacy related to emergency management policy at all levels of government in Canada.
- ► Karla Karcioglu is one of this year's five winners of the Jack Webster Foundation Student Journalism Awards, selected from journalism schools across BC. The award comes with a \$2,000 cheque towards her studies.
- ▶ Wes Koczka, late Associate Vice President, International and CEO Global Operations, was recognized by the Canadian Bureau for International Education with a 2013 Excellence Award. Wes received a posthumous CBIE Member Emeritus Award to recognize his long-term service and support. "Wes believed universities have an obligation to not only educate individuals, but also to nurture citizens with learned worldviews to assist them in advancing humankind in an increasingly global society."
- ▶ Linda Kupp, Institutional Planning and Analysis, was recently elected President of the Canadian University Consortium (CUSC), which assesses the Canadian university experience by surveying representative student populations enrolled in participating universities.

- ▶ Bill Roberts, Psychology, has been appointed as the new Editor of the Canadian Journal of Behavioural Science. The peer-reviewed journal is published jointly by the Canadian Psychological Association and the American Psychological Association, with grant support from the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC). Justin and Alanna were also named the PACWEST Players of the Year, and Tom McManus won PACWEST Women's Coach of the Year, Justin and Oriol were PACWEST Men's 1st Team All-Stars, and **Kyle Fertile**, **Travis Froelich**, and **Ashley** Raynes were 2nd Team All-Stars. Alanna, Browyn, and Marlie Rittinger were PACWEST Women's 1st Team All-Stars, and Kelsey Martin and Laura Smylie were 2nd Team All-Stars. Laura and Braeden Burrows were named PACWEST Playoff MVPs.


