News

► Largest Private Donation in TRU History

Amidst the spectacle of the carnival-themed TRU Foundation Gala on Feb. 15 two significant donations to TRU were announced:

- > The **Dr. Donald R. Andrews Law Endowment** of \$100,000 has been established to fund initiatives that will allow TRU Law to be supportive of its students, competitive with other law faculties and at the forefront of legal education.
- A long time friend of TRU, **Ken Lepin** announced his gift of \$2.25 million. This gift brought his life-time contributions to TRU to \$2.5 million, the most generous private donor in the history of the university.

► RBC Supports Women in Trades

On Feb. 12, the RBC Foundation launched the RBC Women in Trades Training Program at TRU, with a commitment of \$700,000, the bank's largest donation in the province outside of the Lower Mainland. Supporting women in trades foundation programs with bursaries and mentorship, the program includes the RBC Bursary for Learning Success (70 bursaries of \$3,000 each awarded over 10 years), RBC Leadership Training for volunteer female mentors, and an RBC Mentorship Coordinator. http://inside.tru.ca/2014/02/12/700000-grant-from-rbc-foundation-launches-the-rbc-women-in-trades-training-program/

► CIBC Donation Supports Business Students

On Jan. 16, CIBC donated \$150,000 to the TRU School of Business and Economics to support 70 renewable awards in the Bachelor of Business Administration program over the next five years. The CIBC Awards in Business Administration, valued at \$2,000 annually for up to five years, will be awarded to 13 undergraduates in the program. An additional \$4,000 scholarship will be awarded each year to a student who is considered to have achieved exemplary performance in the program.

► Sweater Day 2014

On a -20 degree morning, TRU students, faculty and staff showed off their best—or worst—sweaters on Student Street as part of TRU's participation in National Sweater Day on Feb. 6. TRU turned down the heat from 23 degrees Celsius to 21 degrees to help fight climate change. Last year roughly 40 gigajoules of natural gas heat was saved on the day, resulting in energy cost savings of \$400.

► Legal Information Service Launched

TRU Law launched its new Legal Information Service on Jan. 30, offering information (not legal advice) on a range of legal issues. Law students will provide general legal information and referrals to the Kamloops community and TRU students, as well as assisting TRU students involved in student appeals.

► TELUS Establishes Science Endowment

TELUS made a \$100,000 investment to establish the TELUS Excellence in Science Endowment Fund commemorating the opening of their new Data Centre on McGill. This fund is the largest corporate endowment in Science at TRU and will provide one award for an undergraduate student in Mathematics, Statistics or Computing Science and one award for a graduate student who is conducting research on a project that deals with Optimization and Decision Science.

► WolfPack Versus the Heat in President's Cup

At the conclusion of the WolfPack men's basketball final home game of the season on Feb. 15, TRU won the men's trophy for the first annual "President's Cup", a competition between TRU's WolfPack and UBC-Okanagan's the Heat. Points were awarded for head-to-head PACWEST/Canada West victories in men's and women's soccer, volleyball, golf and basketball throughout the year. UBCO took home the women's trophy.

▶ Chamber of Commerce Social

The Career Education department hosted its first social for local businesses and organizations from the Kamloops Chamber of Commerce on Feb. 5. Over 80 Chamber members were in attendance, along with faculty, staff and students, including Bachelor of Business Administration student

Megan Higgins, who shared her perspective as a Co-op student. TRU had been on a waitlist for over two years for the opportunity to host a Chamber social.

► Chinese New Year Dinner and Dance

Students, faculty, staff and community members celebrated Chinese New Year at the annual gala hosted by the TRUSU Chinese Students and Scholars Association Jan. 31. Guests enjoyed dinner and performances, fireworks and dancing to ring in the Year of the Horse.

► Wildlife Habitat Canada Awards Natural Resource Science Faculty

Natural Resource Science faculty members **Catherine Tarasoff, Tom Pypker, Brian Heise** and **Wendy Gardner** were awarded \$25,000 by Wildlife Habitat Canada to research lowcost benthic barriers as an effective yellow flag iris control mechanism in high priority waterfowl habitat areas.

- ▶ Respiratory Therapy alumna Ingrid Hakanson ('07) is part of the cast of a six-part Knowledge Network television series, "Emergency Room: Life and Death at Vancouver General Hospital", that shares the stories of the clinicians and staff who work in one of Canada's busiest emergency departments, as well as the patients they serve. The CASN Accreditation Bureau encourages greater collaboration among Canadian nursing institutions and this will include TRU in the national voice of Nursing.
- ► The School of Trades and Technology's Dream Home won gold at the Canadian Home Builders' Association (CHBA) of BC's Georgie Awards for Best Public-Private Partnership. Winners were announced at a gala event Feb. 1 in Vancouver.
