Achievements

- ▶ Sandra Cantin, ('13) was presented with the Lieutenant Governor's Silver Medal at the Foundation Student-Donor Awards Ceremony Nov. 21. The medal is awarded to a student who has graduated from a program of less than two years in length, who has achieved a high GPA and has contributed to TRU or the larger community.
- ▶ Chris Hunt, Law, received a \$9000 grant from the BC Law Foundation on Nov. 15 for his research project on the state of Canada's statutory and common law privacy torts. On the same day, his recent award-winning article on privacy in the Queen's Law Journal was cited in a Supreme Court of Canada decision, Alberta (Information and Privacy Commissioner) v. United Food and Commercial Workers, Local 401.
- ▶ Jan Lisiecki, Bachelor of Music student, has won this year's Gramophone Magazine Young Artist of the Year Award. A classical pianist, Jan is the first North American in the last 25 years to have been given that honour, and at only 18, he has released his second album on Deutsche Grammophon, received the Leonard Bernstein Award, and was nominated for a Juno.

- ▶ Larissa Pepper, Bachelor of Business Administration student, was presented with the Co-op Student of the Year Award at the Foundation Student-Donor Awards ceremony Nov. 21.
- ▶ The School of Trades and Technology's Dream Home is a nominee for the Canadian Home Builders' Association (CHBA) of BC's Georgie Awards, for Best Public-Private Partnership. Georgie Award winners will be announced February 1 in Vancouver. On October 31, MP Cathy McLeod sent the School of Trades and Technology a Certificate of Congratulations for its recent Gold Keystone Award from the CHBA-Central Interior in the Fortis BC Building Energy Efficiency category.
- ▶ Gordon Tarzwell, Vice-Provost, Open Learning, has been appointed President and Chair of the board of directors of the Canadian Virtual University consortium (CVU), a collaboration of Canadian universities specializing in online and distance education.
